NEW ONLINE CLASSES - On demand, work at your own pace

I can't even tell you how thrilled I am so be able to announce that I have TWO new online classes available on my website. After many hiccups, I finally have my on-demand class section up and running. You can take these at your own pace, any time, even wearing your pajamas. Both classes have more than an hour of full captioned video, downloads, links and more.

- The **Trinket Box** class is a project that was sold out the last time I taught it via Zoom. You can choose to make a waterlily or sunflower box and learn two different embroidery stitches. The project takes about 2 hours.
- **A Trio of Techniques** is an intro to fabric design class using low-cost and easily accessible tools to make some fun mixed media designs. Great for dabbling your toes in the world of fabric design.

Starts July 13. Thursdays at Noon (CDT).

Spend an hour each week stitching in this fun hand embroidery sampler class, **held online via Zoom**. Each week, you will learn a new stitch and complete a section of the parrots design. The 8 inch parrots panel was designed by Becka and is printed on 100% cotton fabric. A pre-washed panel is included in your class fee and will be mailed to you after you register. You provide the rest of the materials and tools for class. Beginners are enthusiastically welcomed; no embroidery experience is necessary.

Tools: Cherry wood needle case and stiletto point from [Sistermaide.etsy.com](https://sistermaide.etsy.com). These popped up in my feed randomly and I had to get some. These feel lovely and the shop makes all kinds of different tools in different woods.

Drawing: Papermate Handwriting pencils. I love these for sketching! It's a mechanical pencil but with a super thick lead.
